Our many wood bridges have a finite life span and have to be repaired or replaced when needed. Your dollars have allowed us to purchase dog stations to supply dog owners with refuse bags and a place to put them after use.



We are in a constant battle to keep the Tenakill Brook clean of debris and obstructions, not only for the obvious esthetic reason but also for public health reasons; it flows into the Oradell Reservoir and eventually comes out of our faucets when we turn the tap to fill a drinking glass or fill a tub to give our kids a bath.
