Student Field Trips & Programs 2014

The Demarest Nature Center is proud once again to fulfill its mission in partnering with County Road, Luther Lee Emerson and Demarest Middle School to provide funding for educational programs that benefit the children of our community. A portion of your membership dues was used to support these unique programs that engage our children with nature, the environment, and local history.

Marc Gussen, a local charismatic environmental educator, led students from the County Road School. Each Kindergarten class explored the nature trails of the Demarest Nature Center to explore the local flora and fauna. Our 1st grade classes explored the Closter Nature Center on an expedition to find and study butterflies.

At the Luther Lee Emerson School the Demarest Nature Center is proud to contribute to funding the second grade trip to Abmas Farm and the third grade trip to Liberty Science Center. During the Abmas Farm trip students visited the Health Barn to learn about the connections between fruits, vegetables, farming and nutrition. In conjunction with the their curriculum, Marc Gussen visited each 4th grade class to demonstrate New Jersey's native history and the Lenape way of life.

Students at Demarest Middle School benefited from DNC funding this year as well. In conjunction with Earth day, students in the 6th and 7th grade researched the benefits of plants, classified various plants and planted various seeds purchased by the Nature Center.


Meet the Members
